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
#### About this dataset

The data in this report is from children and young people (CYP) engaging with specialist children and young people's domestic abuse services between April 2024 and March 2025, and who consented to having their data used for research and monitoring purposes. Case workers filled out a total of 1,853 valid Intake forms and 1,853 valid Exit forms on behalf of CYP engaging with seven services using the SafeLives Insights portal.


SafeLives runs the largest database of domestic abuse cases in the UK. Our Insights database has records of more than 868000 unique cases of adults experiencing domestic abuse from 2009 to date, and a further 8,000 unique cases of children in domestic abuse households from 2011 to date. These datasets give us an unparalleled overview of the picture of domestic abuse.

We hope that everyone working to stop domestic abuse will be able to use this data to improve their services so that victims and families get the right help sooner.







#### **Service inputs**

#### Cases used in the analysis

In the period April 2024 to March 2025, caseworkers submitted 1,853 intake forms for children entering children and young people's (CYP) services.

These forms contain information about client demographics, and the characteristics of the abuse that clients accessing CYP services are experiencing.

For the period April 2023 to March 2024 there were 2,019 forms submitted and for the period April 2022 to March 2023 there were 1,971 forms submitted.

Caseworkers submitted 156 review forms for children entering children and young people's (CYP) services for the period April 2024 to March 2025.

These forms are used to record further or previously undisclosed abuse

For the period April 2023 to March 2024 there were 65 review forms submitted and for the period April 2022 to March 2023 there were 63 review forms submitted.

Exit forms

Caseworkers submitted 1,853 exit forms for children entering children and young people's (CYP) services for the period April 2024 to March 2025.

These forms were then matched to their corresponding intake form to provide a picture of client outcomes at the point of exit compared to intake. They also contain information about what interventions the client accessed.

Intake dates may occur prior to the period April 2024 to March 2025.

For the period April 2023 to March 2024 there were 1,741 exit forms submitted and for the period April 2022 to March 2023 there were 1,673 exit forms
