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About this dataset

This data report forms part of a series of publications from SafeLives' Insights dataset. It contains 500 unique individual cases at intake and 248 matched cases at exit, drawn from 5 sexual violence services which used the SafeLives Insights outcome measurement service between April 2022 and March 2023.

We hope that everyone working to stop domestic abuse will be able to use this data to improve their services so that victims and families get the right help sooner.



The results for 52% of clients supported with criminal justice were police reports with no further action (NFA)



Of clients who received NFA 57% of cases were due to police withdrawing the case



At exit 90% of clients had not experienced any further abuse since intake or their last review

Service inputs

In the period April 2022 to March 2023, caseworkers submitted 500 intake forms for clients entering sexual violence services.

These forms contain information about client demographics, and the characteristics of the abuse that clients accessing sexual violence services are

For the period April 2021 to March 2022 there were 730 forms submitted and for the period April 2020 to March 2021 there were 654 forms submitted.

Caseworkers submitted 248 exit forms for clients leaving sexual violence services for the period April 2022 to March 2023.

These forms were then matched to their corresponding intake form to provide a picture of client outcomes at the point of exit compared to intake. They also contain information about what interventions the client accessed.

Intake dates may occur prior to the period April 2022 to March 2023.

For the period April 2021 to March 2022 there were 623 exit forms submitted and for the period April 2020 to March 2021 there were 429 exit forms

Caseworkers supported 136 clients with criminal justice for the period April 2022 to March 2023.

These forms provide information on the outcomes of any criminal justice interventions at exit, as well as support provided by caseworkers during the

For the period April 2021 to March 2022 there were 431 criminal justice forms submitted and for the period April 2020 to March 2021 there were 218 criminal justice forms submitted.
