# The primary focus of the Marac

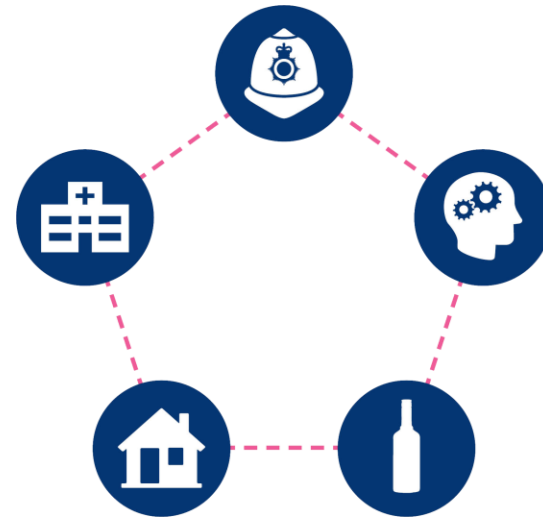
At the heart of a Marac is the working assumption that **no single agency or individual can see the complete picture of the life of a victim**, but all may have insights that are crucial to their safety.

A victim identified at high risk of serious harm or homicide needs a coordinated, multi-agency response with all agencies sharing relevant information to develop an action plan that is comprehensive, robust and addresses the risk to all parties.

## Agencies working together for an effective Marac

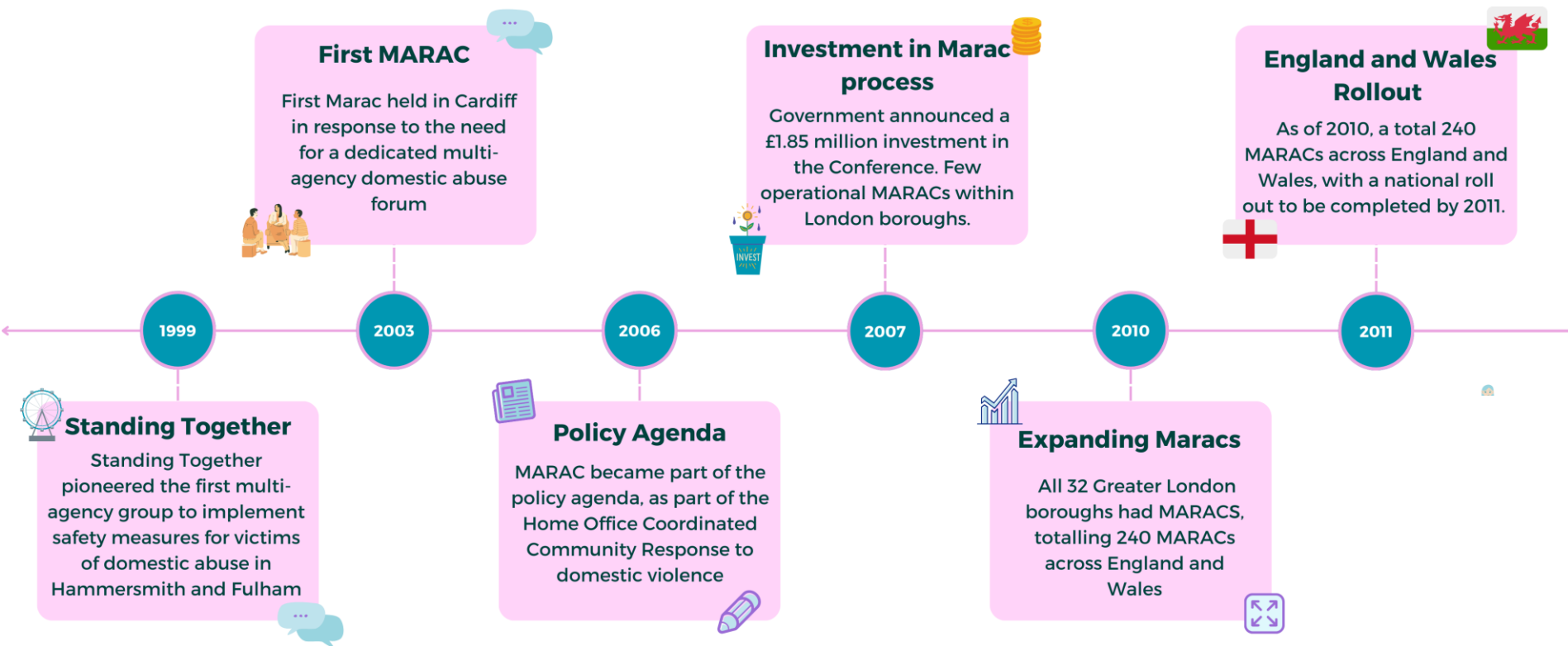
1. Police
2. Idva
3. Probation (both NPS & CRC)
4. Children's Services
5. Mental Health
6. Primary Health
7. Substance Misuse Services
8. Housing
9. Adult Safeguarding

Also valuable: Education; specialist DV/minority support services; secondary health such as health visitor/ midwifery



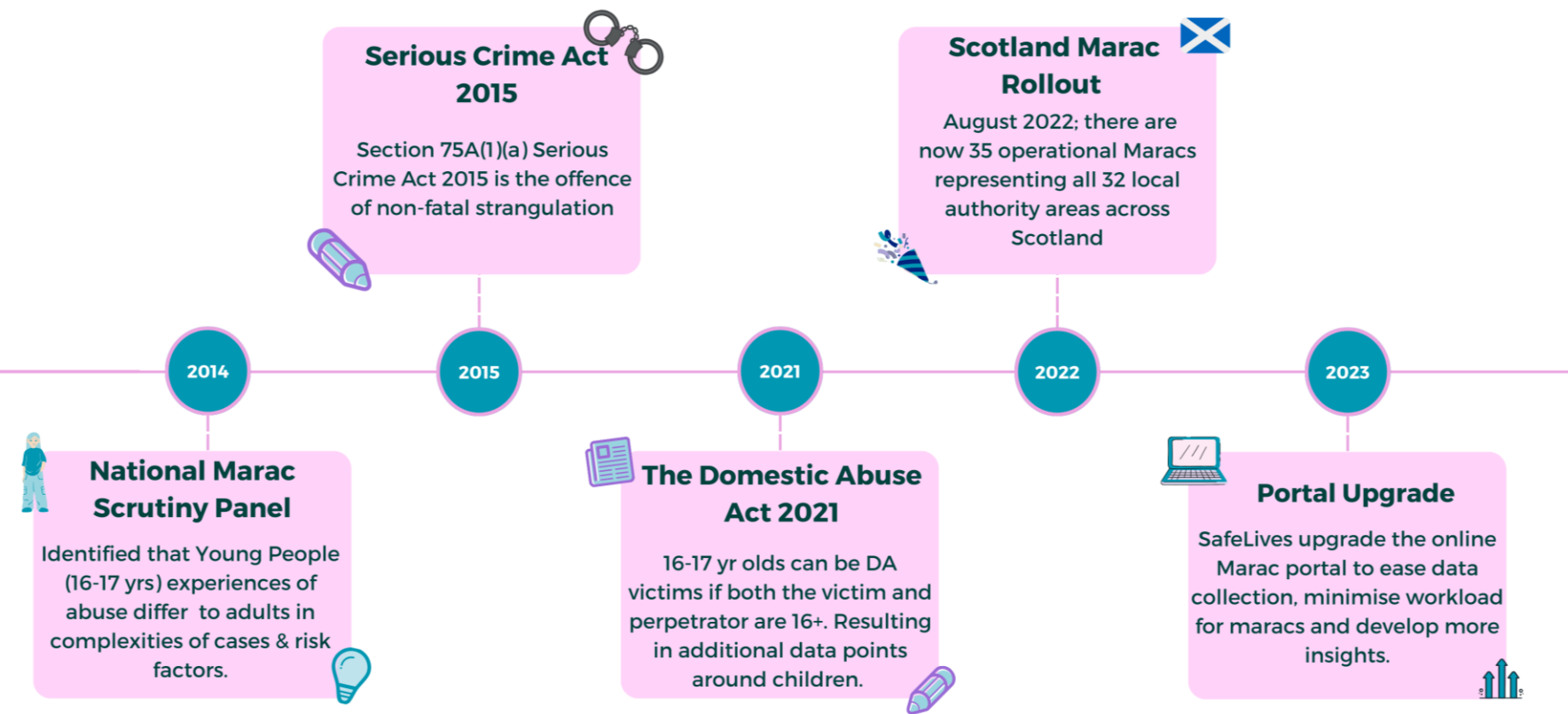

# New Marac Portal Development



## National consultation resulted in:

- Expanded data collection v duplication of data entry
- Benchmarking
- Piloting of new tools for both data collection and reporting

## New portal built and piloted summer 2023:

- Flexibility and simplicity in uploading
- Useful new visualisations for benchmarking
- Multiple years and quarters of data easily accessible

## New categories of data collection January 2024

# So what's in Marac data now?

## We analyse and report:

- Case volume data
- Resource recommendations (Idvas and Admins)
- Demographic data
- Referral route data

## New categories of data 2024:

- Number of cases with children in the household
- Number of victims age 65+
- Number of cases in each of the 5 Office of National Statistics (ONS) top level ethnicity categories

# The Impact of Marac Data | Examples

## Implementation of the new offence of Non-Fatal Strangulation: policy influencing at national level

- Non-fatal strangulation (NFS) offence created in June 2022
- NFS Steering Group – DAC, SafeLives, CPS, NPCC, APCC, Probation, NHSE, Bangor University
- Focussed on health responses to physical injuries from NFS and forensic medical evidence
- Supporting PCCs with developing relevant pathways to healthcare – sought information from Marac data
- Investigate if/how support services have NFS as a marker and healthcare referral pathways

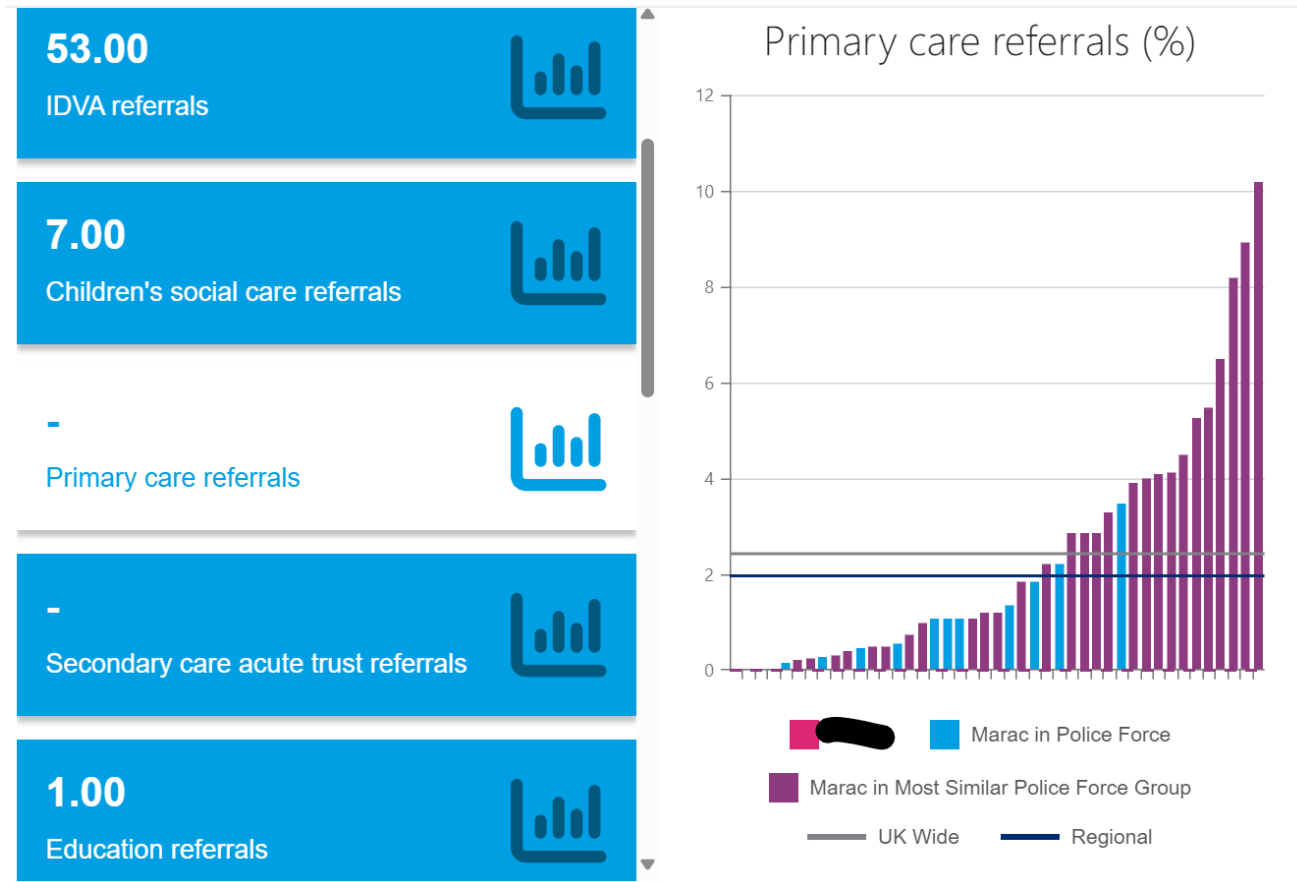
# Learning: Marac data and Insights Adults DA Dataset

- Insights is an **outcomes measurement tool** for domestic abuse and sexual violence services gathering individual survivor-level data across areas
- Insights data shows that clients who have experienced NFS tend to be at much higher risk of harm from multiple types of abuse
- They are more likely to have visited A&E or the police as a result of the abuse and to have had their case discussed at Marac. They are more likely to have a **mental health need**, not previously identified by the NFS steering group
- By combining Insights data with Marac data, we were able to estimate that at least **19,000 victims** whose case has been heard at Marac in England and Wales in the last 12 months will have experienced NFS
- We fed back key themes of our analysis from data and practice voice to the NFS steering group
- We used our learning from Marac and Insights to speak to GPs in the PMA about the meaning of Marac referrals and data

A Marac within a Police Force Area in North West England used the tables of referral route data and the new visualisations on the portal Dashboards showing comparisons of health referrals to Maracs in their local area to identify a training need.

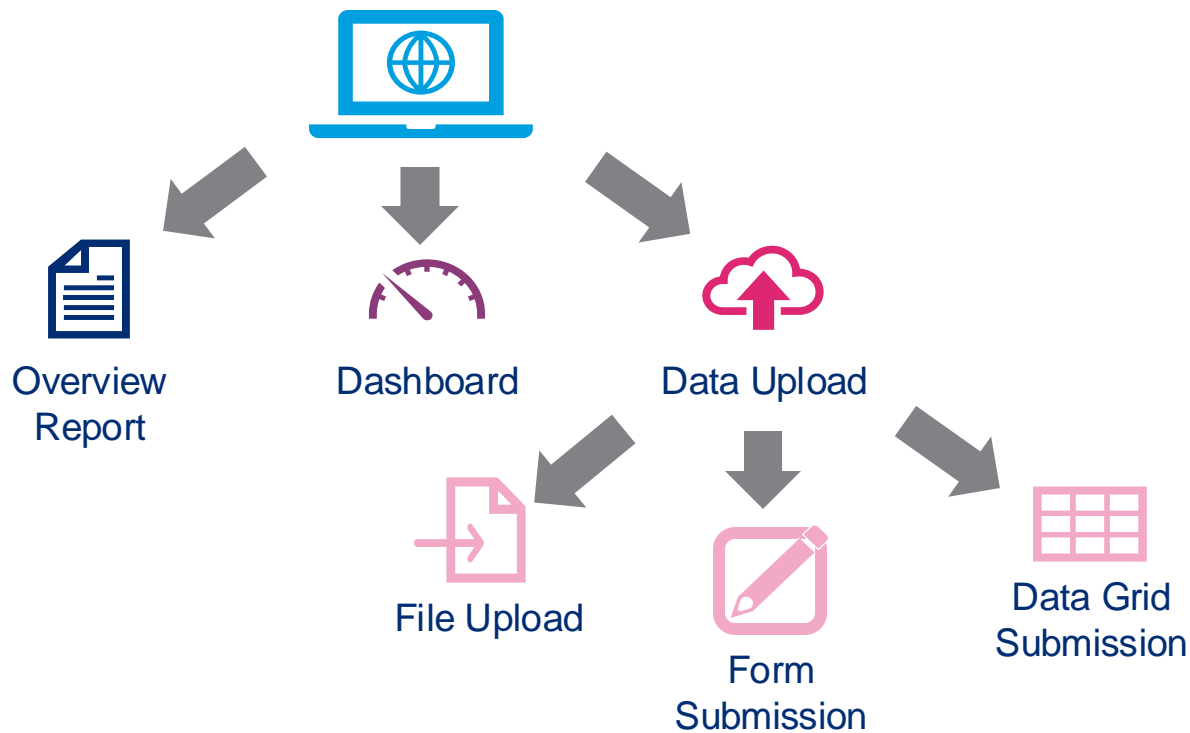

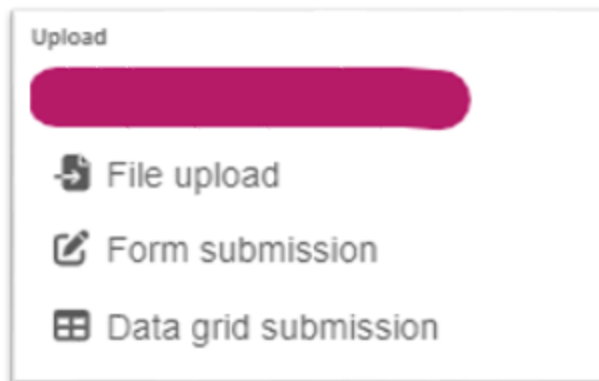

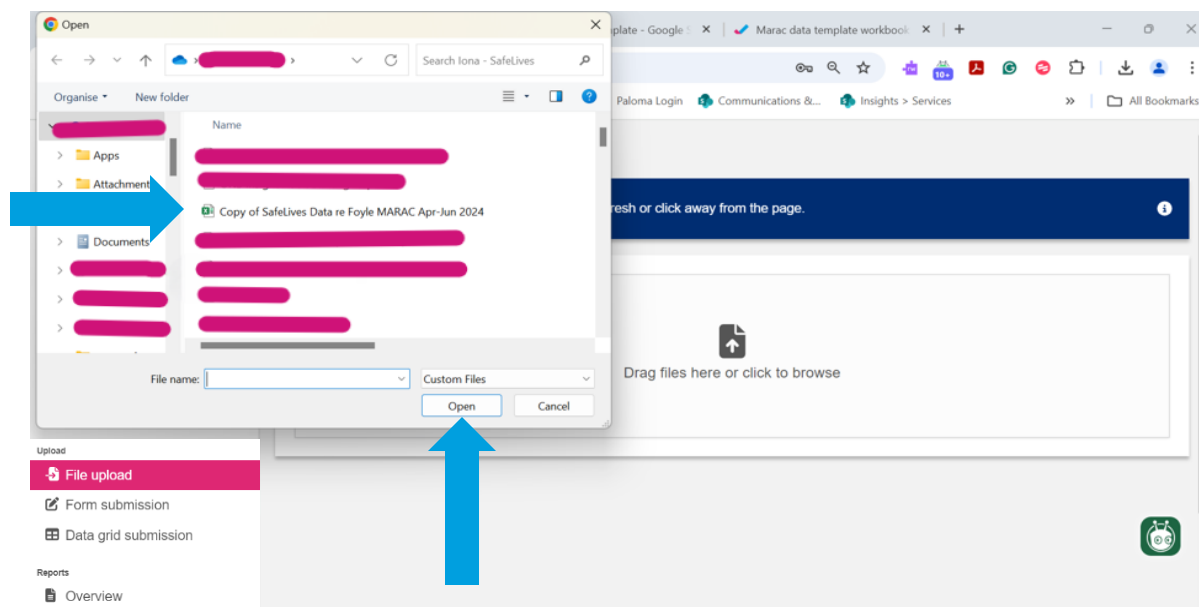

3. Save document, e.g. 'City of London Q3 2024 Marac Meetings'
4. Log into Portal and go to **File Upload**
5. Click on the upload section 
6. Open saved marac meetings doc from the folder it opens.

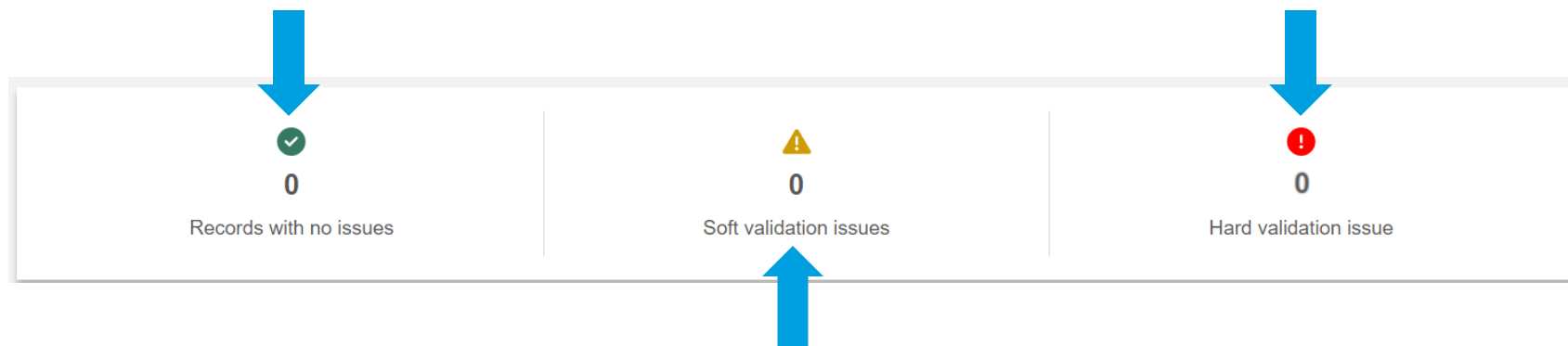

Soft validation issues show when different data is submitted for dates previously uploaded to the platform. More info [here](#) (Pg.10)

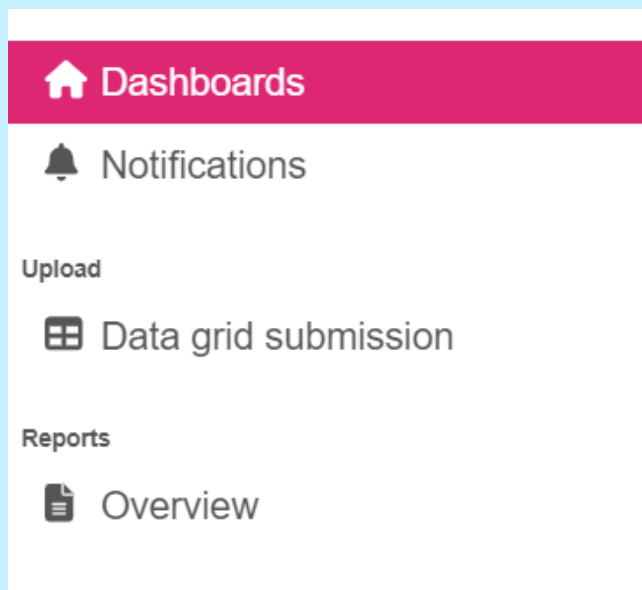

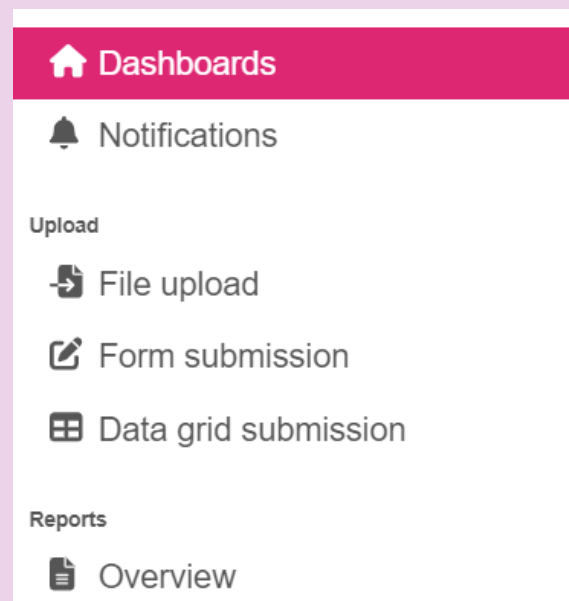
## Marac Chair Persona
